Provincial Technical Coach Position

The Table Tennis Saskatchewan Provincial Technical Coach is responsible for the overall planning, identification, training, and development of an elite Saskatchewan provincial table tennis team. The successful candidate will identify, train, and develop athletes for the National Championships and the Canada Winter Games. The Provincial Technical Coach, as a member of the High-Performance Committee, will design and implement table tennis programs necessary for a highly competitive Saskatchewan team at major national/regional championships and the Canada Winter Games. The Saskatchewan Provincial Technical Coach will also be responsible for the organization and development of Table Tennis as a recreational, competitive, and school sport in Saskatchewan. The Technical coach will also be responsible for the development of all levels of coaches in the province.

Qualifications: Experience in coaching and developing elite table tennis athletes. Preference may be given to a candidate with a NCCP Competition Development Coaching Certification (the technical coaches must be fully NCCP certified prior to the 2023 Canada Winter Games). The candidate must have the ability to write and speak in English effectively. Good organizational, program planning, interpersonal and public relations skills are essential. The candidate must have the ability to plan and work with minimal supervision. Willingness to travel and is expected to work outside of normal hours.

SCHEDULE "A"

PROVINCIAL TECHNICAL COACH/COACHES

CONDITIONS AND DUTIES OF EMPLOYMENT

GENERAL

The Saskatchewan Technical Coaches shall be responsible for the identification and development of the Saskatchewan Provincial Team focusing on the Canadian National Junior and Senior Championships and the Canada Winter Games. They will assist the High Performance Committee in the development of recruiting programs to the extent that these programs are deemed necessary to insure the development of a Competitive Winter Games teams. The Saskatchewan Table Tennis Provincial Technical Coach shall also be responsible for the organization and development of Table Tennis as a recreational and competitive sport in Saskatchewan.

ACTION PLAN

Goals of TTSask, leading to the 2023 Canada Winter Games and beyond are:

- > Increase the number of certified coaches and develop a network of provincial coaches.
- > Increase the talent pool for the National program and the Canada Winter Games program.
- > Increase participation at the Provincial School Championships by lobbying the Saskatchewan High School Athletic Association to include table tennis as a recognized school sport.
- > Increase the number of Saskatchewan athletes on the Table Tennis Canada's National Team Lists.
 - > Increase the profile of table tennis in the province as a recognized sport.
 - > Place athletes in the top 5 in national rankings annually starting in 2022
 - > Host at least one Inter-Provincial or National High Performance training camp annually

RESPONSIBILITY

The Saskatchewan Provincial Technical Coach is responsible to the Executive Director of the TTSask and the TTSask Technical Committee chairperson. They shall submit a brief written report of activities and expenditures to the Executive Director and will be required to attend all meetings of the Board of Directors.

ONE - YEAR PLAN

The Saskatchewan Technical coach shall submit to the technical committee for approval, a one - year general plan outlining the programs and activities to be undertaken by the Saskatchewan Provincial coach.

In the event that the technical committee does not approve a submitted plan, the Saskatchewan Provincial Technical Coach shall revise the plan in accordance with the directives of the technical committee.

TTSask is in full support of the NCCP program and will require any coaches hired to become fully certified in the Competition Development Stream by 2023

Coaches Job Description

SPECIFIC DUTIES

The following duties are to be included in the one - year plan

Conduct TTSask programs in a language that is always understood by all participants.

Increase participation at the school level by conducting special physical education programs, school clinics and camps.

Devise and implement a comprehensive identification and recruiting program for athletes and coaches in coordination with the technical committee.

Develop a complete competitive schedule as per the yearly plan and ensure that all athletes are entered in all competitions correctly and within the deadlines. Ensure all athletes, in the provincial program, that are competing at any competitions are aware of their schedules and events they are entered in.

Travel and accommodation plans for all provincial team level competition, camps and clinics, are the responsibility of the coach and executive director, they will work together to make plans.

In conjunction with the chaperone, it is the coach's responsibility to ensure the safety of all athletes at all training sessions, competitions, camps, clinics and tours.

Develop communication with all athletes throughout the province with regards to the talent identifications processes, locations, dates of identification camps, high performance programs, grassroots training programs and try-outs. The coach will be the liaison between all table tennis athletes in the province and the TTSask Executive Director and technical committee.

The coach will be required to maintain an up to date list of all athletes including names, addresses, date of birth, and other contact information for the athletes that they can use for communication. The coach shall provide the contact list to the TTSask office on a regular basis.

The coach must maintain an up to date list of participants in each program that is facilitated by the coach and for TTSask

Develop and implement comprehensive yearly training programs based on individual and team goals for the current season, the Nationals and Canada Winter Games programs.

Schedule support services necessary to compliment the progress of the Saskatchewan athletes in the areas of: sport nutrition, mental training, exercise physiology, biomechanics, etc.

Undertake direct coaching responsibilities necessary for optimal performance of the selected Canada Winter Games Teams.

Plans – the Technical coach will be responsible to develop a multi-year plan leading up to and beyond the 2023 CWG. The Technical coach will develop a plan for initiatives and implementation on a yearly basis and will provide a monthly plan to the technical committee.

Coach of coaches – Technical Coaches will work with and develop the skills and abilities of the regional coach. They would also develop and implement a coach's education program for all levels of coaching in the province. In addition, they will conduct coaching clinics and provide Technical assistance to coaches of various levels.

Talent Identification – Technical coaches will develop a talent identification process to identify potential table tennis athletes throughout the province and provide them with information on how and where to access our high performance programs.

Training Programs – the Technical Coaches will develop individual training programs for the provincial athletes as well as training programs for all levels of table tennis players in Saskatchewan. The Coaches will be directly involved in the training of the provincial athletes.

Indigenous Sport Development – Technical Coaches would help develop and implement initiatives for the development of table tennis in the Indigenous communities and for the Tony Cote Games and ultimately have Indigenous athletes participating in all levels of competition in Saskatchewan.

To develop and implement a full Sport Science program in conjunction with the Sport Science and Medicine Council which will be consistent with the standards set out by SaskSport. The technical Coach will report the progress of all coaching initiatives, progress on coach education initiatives and the progression of athletes on a regular basis to the technical committee.
